It's been a surprisingly busy summer in the library service. An independent report has been commissioned into a National eHealth Library for Ireland. The researcher, Mr. Ken Chad began this work in late August. To date, two online consultative workshops have been held involving internal and external stakeholders throughout the wider health service.

A benchmarking exercise is underway and a further workshop due in October. This important work is possible with the help of our partners in the National Doctors Training and Planning Unit. The Library Evidence team have been busy supporting NIAC with summaries of evidence on key vaccination topics. # Library facilities developments

This particular library was a long time in the planning and faced numerous setbacks due to Covid-19 restrictions and related priorities.





The 2021 HSE Open Access Research Awards are now open for entry. This year has seen the Irish health services deal with a number of unprecedented challenges, from the massive cyber-attack in May to the rollout of the largest vaccination programme in the country's history.

Through it all, clinicians and researchers have continued to deliver high quality healthcare – and to research new treatments, new advances in science and health, new ways of improving health outcomes. The HSE Open Access Research Awards aims to shine a light on this activity and to thank those who have chosen to make their work available through Open Access, making their discoveries and advances freely available to all.

- The research must have been published within the past two years (24 months)
- The research must be available in full text in an Open Access forum (and added to the Lenus repository, pre or post entry)





I have met the most kind, hard-working and innovative people across the HSE. Although, I don't exactly know what the future holds, staying in the HSE is definitely one of my options.




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

# Learning and Teaching in a virtual world: the NHLKS Information Skills Team Nicola Fay

The last eighteen months have been challenging for all of us on many levels, and technology has changed the way we approach our work as well as our personal lives (who had heard of Zoom before last March, let alone attended a Zoom table quiz or birthday party!).

The NHLKS Information Skills Team was tasked with transitioning a well-established, locally delivered programme of in-person training courses to an online platform. The process began with getting to grips with WebEx Meetings and WebEx Training (the online platforms provided by the HSE) as well as gaining an understanding of the theoretical and practical concepts of delivering training online.

Some members of the team attended a two day course (virtually, of course!) on delivering remote training, which was excellent both for its content and also for experience of being online learners ourselves for two days. We learned the importance of engaging those attending online training with a variety of interactive opportunities (whiteboard, Chat, reaction buttons), providing plenty of breaks, using video capability so that people can see each other and the understanding that any training delivered face to face will probably take twice as long to deliver online! Taking a Powerpoint presentation used in a face to face scenario and sharing it on an online platform will simply not do the trick!

The first course to be developed by the Information Skills Team was a very simple forty-five minute Introduction to HSE Library Services, initially delivered twice weekly from September 2020. We recognised the need for a team of three to deliver the sessions - Host, Presenter and Support. The Presenter can't present and look at the questions that might come into the Chat function and so the role of Host and Support is to monitor the Chat, deal with any initial technical difficulties that attendees inevitably have and be ready to take over in the event of any problems with the Presenter's WiFi!

All of us on the Team were on a steep learning curve in terms of technology and presentation skills but feedback was positive and attendance at sessions by HSE staff from across the country and all disciplines was positive too. The cyber-attack caused some difficulties for us. However, the willingness of Team members to use their own devices and WiFi enabled all of the scheduled courses to continue as planned, albeit with reduced numbers in attendance.

The cyber-attack caused some difficulties for us. However, the willingness of Team members to use their own devices and WiFi enabled all of the scheduled courses to continue as planned, albeit with reduced numbers in attendance.

From January to June we delivered 26 sessions to 308 attendee,s and our catalogue of courses has extended to include Searching CINAHL and Medline (basic and advanced), Searching the Cochrane Library, Searching Systematically, Introduction to Open Access Publishing, Management and Leadership Information, Introduction to Point of Care Tools and Information for Mental Health.

We also use pre- and post-test surveys to evaluate the learning of attendees. Registration for all courses is managed online and attendees receive a survey following the course which assesses the performance of the both the trainer and the quality of the online experience. These feed into the Key Performance Indicators for the Team. All the courses have been accredited for CPD/CEU by the RCSI and NMBI.

So, a challenging eighteen months but ultimately rewarding in terms of the development of the Information Skills Team and what it has been able to achieve. We learn and improve each time we deliver an online course, and one of the most valuable experiences of all has been the opportunity to work with and learn from colleagues from around the country whom we hadn't worked with before.
