It has been a busy summer for Health Library Ireland. In preparation for our new library strategy, an online training session for Library staff was held with Andy Priestner, an expert and published author of "<u>User Experience in Libraries</u>".

This empowered our staff with the tools to talk to colleagues in the HSE to see what their opinions are and what libraries are doing well (or not so well).

The summer and September has been a period of gathering user experience stories across the HSE which will all feed into our new strategy.


Plans are advancing for a refurbishment of UHK Library and a complete new library at Wexford Hospital following the fire there. Both of these libraries should be completed before the end of the year.

A <u>summary of evidence on unscheduled care</u> was completed for broad adoption in the HSE by the Library Evidence team. A calendar of training events is available with a variety of sessions suited to different learners.

On October 4th, a rerun of the popular Masterclass in publishing is taking place with Dr Ximena Alvira (right). And on October 10th, a webinar for public health is scheduled with senior public health leaders.

HSE Open Access Research Awards 2023

The 10th annual HSE Open Access Research Awards are open for entry as of 22nd September. Run by Health Library Ireland, the

awards were established in 2014 to acknowledge the work of researchers in our health services (many of whom work without funding), and to promote the uptake of Open Access publishing on the grounds of equitability, academic advantage and scientific innovation.

Since then the awards have become an integral part of the HSE's research landscape, even surviving the 'lockdown years' of 2020-2021, when they moved online. This year the awards presentation will be a hybrid event, with an in-person component in Dr Steevens' Hospital Library and a simultaneous livestream.

The categories for this year's event are:

Acute Care and Hospitals
Community and Social Care
Mental Health and Disabilities
Integrated Services
Climate or Environmental Health



Entries will be reviewed by a panel of judges with research experience. There will be a prize for each category, and an overall winner will also be selected as representing the best of all submissions received. All entries will be made available in the HSE's Lenus repository.

This year there will be a special Innovation prize to recognise outstanding developments in practice or service delivery.

Submissions will be accepted up to the closing date of Friday, October 27th. Queries may be addressed to <u>lenus@hse.ie</u>.

HSE National Central Repository is live

Health Library Ireland are delighted to report that <u>HSE National Central Repository</u> is now live on the HSE website. It is the single source for accessing, storage and document management of approved HSE National Policies, Procedures, Protocols, Guidelines and Clinical Guidelines (PPPGs).

This is the first version of the HSE National Central Repository and it will continue to be developed with our colleagues in HSE Digital Communications based on our user feedback and document management requirements. The repository will be officially launched by the CEO, Mr Bernard Gloster in early December and notification will go out nearer the time via HSE broadcast email.

Presently, there is a categorisation filter by National Policy, Protocol, Procedure, Guideline and Clinical Guideline. A search function for searching by title or topic, will be developed for the repository as part of the wider HSE Digital Communications ongoing work on the HSE website.

What documents does the repository accept?

The HSE National Central Repository accepts approved National PPPGs (full document) in PDF format only and cannot at present facilitate a suite of documentation.

If you have additional documentation to accompany your PPPG, these documents should be sent as normal to HSE Digital at <u>digital@hse.ie</u> in pdf format for listing on your webpage. To clarify, your PPPG will be listed with all your other documentation on your webpage, but it will be the only document that opens up via a link to the HSE National Central Repository.

Requirements of the HSE National Central Repository

All new National PPPGs in development, and existing PPPGs undergoing review, must use the National Template which can be accessed in the Resources section of the HSE National Central Repository. The cover page of the template has been updated to meet the document management requirements of the repository. You can also access the existing National Framework for Developing PPPGs. Both the Framework and Template are being reviewed and are due to be published in late 2023.

Keeping Up to Date

To remain effective throughout your career, you must keep abreast of new research in your chosen field. This is a major challenge; a search on Pubmed reveals that >30 000 articles containing the word stroke were indexed in the platform in 2020. Multiple sources, varied formats, and the sheer volume of available information often lead to a feeling of information overload and to a decision not to read at all.

Keeping up to Date is one of Health Library Ireland's (HLI) services that helps to mitigate information overload and makes access to clinical research faster and easier. Keeping up to Date is the umbrella term for the HLI Current Awareness Services, which are designed to inform you of current trends and developments in your area of interest.

You can sign up for our <u>Research Bulletins</u> which include links to academic journal articles, policies, guidelines, reports and other relevant information aimed at health professionals working in the Irish health service. HLI librarians curate the following bulletins:

We issue the majority of our bulletins quarterly or bi-monthly. The exception is the Big 4 – this provides a featured article from each of the top four core medical journals: BMJ, Lancet, JAMA and NEJM fortnightly. To be included in the mailing list for our Research Bulletins, go to our Health Library Ireland website and sign up today.

Another means of keeping up with the literature is to consult scholarly journals by tracking Table of Contents (ToC) of your preferred journals. Many of our hospital libraries provide ToC alerts for distribution to their clients. Some of these alerts are subject-based, others determined by profession. To check if this service is available to you, contact your <u>local library</u>.

Our Knowledge Support Team are responsible for the strategic development of the Keeping Up To Date service. Earlier this year, the Team conducted research in order to develop and enhance the service.

The result is <u>a comprehensive report</u>, (left) with recommendations to advance and future proof our Current Awareness Services.

Keeping Up to Date (continued)

Research methodologies used for the report included focus group, semi structured interview and questionnaire. Librarians who provide these services participated and shared valuable data on their experiences and knowledge of Current Awareness Services in HSE Health Library Ireland.



The recommendations are:

- Lead a national approach to standardise, organise and deliver Current Awareness Services
- Staff to collaborate more in the provision of Current Awareness Services nationally
- More strategic promotion of services
- Use of automation to improve efficiency, address staff challenges and extend the range of services
- Evaluate services to measure impact, drive standardisation and improve quality
- Build stakeholder engagement to champion, co-create and ensure a responsive, high quality Current Awareness Services
- Plan for the future to ensure best methods and practices are used, identify emerging trends and innovations in the provision of Current Awareness Services.



After analysing the findings, the Team made seven recommendations for the future development of Current Awareness Services.





Koha Library Management System Upgrade

Patrons are used to searching our catalogue and finding the information they need. For that to happen, a lot of work takes place behind the scenes, in the backend of our databases.

Elements of cataloguing, circulation and searching are related to our library management software Koha. Koha is an open source software library automation package created in 1999. It is in constant development by different libraries, companies and volunteers that use it all over the world.



The 22.11 version we already upgraded in our staging server includes <u>13 new features</u>, <u>351 enhancements</u>, <u>3 security fixes and 551 bugfixes</u>.

In October, this upgrade is going to be installed on our live server.

We hope the user experience gets better with these developments.

"Single sign-on" to electronic resources - update



As part of the move to a single sign on for library staff, we are redesigning the registration form (left). We hope this will capture good information on library users to enable more targeted library services.
